Who can be a Weld County Foster Parent?

We understand love and families come in many shapes and sizes. Whether you're single, married, widowed or divorced, currently with or without children, home owner or renter, you can be a foster parent. Our focus is to find foster and foster adopt families that are patient, loving and able to provide a safe, nurturing home.

Basic requirements:

- 21 years of age or older
- Financially stable (your family's present needs are consistently met)
- Must be able to pass a background check and home study

Foster Family Responsibilities

You must learn about the needs of the child and receive training, as well as:

- Provide a safe, stable, healing home for a child in need
- Help children in difficult circumstances grow, learn, hope and thrive
- Model positive parenting and act as a mentor for biological families
- Provide non-physical discipline
- Provide transportation to appointments
- Attend further training

Your Support Team: Weld County Foster Care Services

We are here to help you with ongoing educational, emotional and financial support. Your team of social workers, therapists, and other professionals is tailored to the foster child's/children's specific needs.

Weld County Foster Care Services also offers:

- 24 x 7 on-call support
- Colorado Medicaid to cover medical/dental care and counseling

 Monthly maintenance payment for the care of the child based on the child's needs
